

Preservation

Lompoc's Old Newspaper Project

Myra Manfrina had been telling me about the Lompoc Journal and Lompoc Review, early Lompoc newspapers, now stored in the Library basement and starting to disintegrate. As newspapers at that time were only published once a week, their content differed from the Lompoc Record.

With the assistance of Ashley Chavez, Librarian, the newspapers were inventoried and a search began on current preservation techniques. One priority was to have the newspapers searchable online, however server space was just not available 2

locally. On the Internet was a web-site, The California Digital Newspaper Collection (http://cdnc.ucr.edu/cdnc) and through the help of Brian Geiger, PhD, Director, Center for Bibliographical Studies and Research University of California, Riverside, ascertained that they would be interested in having our newspapers as part of their collection online. He was able to direct me to companies who could perform the standards newly dictated by the Library of Congress for digital newspapers.

Many thanks to all who donated toward this project, and in October the volumes of the Lompoc Journal and a few loose copies from the historical society dating back to 1894 were sent to Northern Micrographics for microfilming and creating tiff files. The CA Digital Newspaper collection will bundle this with a larger order for digitizing and hopefully will be online for searching later this summer on their web-site and the connection to the Library o f Congress http://chroniclingamerica.loc.gov/.

A few weeks ago the microfilm became available at the Lompoc Library. The Lompoc Review still needs to be archived, so along with donations, Ashley and I are hoping to find some funds through Library Preservation Grants. Donations totaling \$4,500 have been raised and the cost of the Lompoc Journal is \$4,000. Due to the new digitizing requirements by the Library of Congress, it is more expensive than initially calculated. The volume of the Lompoc Review is about 1/3 larger.


